

Animal Control Reference Guide

Have a concern or question about animals? Start by creating an animal control case. Submitting a case gives city staff the information needed to review the issue and respond appropriately.

How to Report an Animal Concern:

Submit Online: Create an Animal Control Case

Florida Law and Anonymous Complaints. Under Florida Statute 162.06, a person reporting a potential code or ordinance violation generally must provide their name and address before an enforcement proceeding may occur. The statute includes an exception for certain imminent threats to public health, safety, welfare, habitat or sensitive resources.
